WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY

World No Tobacco Day is recognized annually on May 31st and the theme for this year is "Tobacco and Heart Disease."

World No Tobacco Day 2018 is aimed at increasing awareness of the link between tobacco use and heart and other Cardiovascular Diseases (CVD).

Tobacco use is an important risk factor for the development of coronary heart disease, stroke, and peripheral vascular disease. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), tobacco use is the second leading cause of CVD, after high blood pressure.

The Eastern Regional Health Authority continues to raise awareness and sensitize persons on the dangers of tobacco consumption.

Additionally, a Smoking Cessation Clinic at the Cumuto Outreach Centre is ongoing.

Clinics are held at the Cumuto Outreach Centre every Thursday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Patients are counselled via a continuous programme with revisits as a method to overcome barriers to stop smoking.

ARE YOU READY FOR A HURRICANE?

HURRICANE SEASON

The Atlantic Hurricane Season spans from June 1 to November 30 each year. This is the period within which tropical cyclones are most likely to occur.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Organization (NOAA), a company based in the United States, focuses on scientific studies in the atmosphere and is predicting a near or above average season for hurricane activity.

NOAA is predicting a total of 10-16 named storms, 5-9 of which will be hurricanes, and a further 1-4 of those hurricanes will be major.

Whether a hurricane season is considered active or not, it is of utmost importance to be prepared. Regardless of the tropical cyclone impact, in Trinidad and Tobago during the Hurricane Season we can expect to be affected by floods.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO PREPARE

Apart from building your emergency kit, here are some things you can do to protect yourself and your property:

- Clear drains around your property.
- Remove debris from gutters and downspouts.
- If you are prone to flooding, move valuables, electrical items and furniture to higher ground.
- Place all important documents, valuables and medical supplies in a waterproof case or bag.
- Keep a list of all emergency telephone numbers.
- If you are affected by floods, landslides etc. contact your local municipal corporation disaster hotline.
