#### **ERHA Christmas Babies**



# "Don't risk getting seriously ill, get the new flu vaccine".



# **Facts About COVID-19 Vaccination**

#### 1. Can a COVID-19 vaccine make me sick with COVID-19?

No. None of the authorized and recommended COVID-19 vaccines or COVID-19 vaccines currently in development in the United States contain the live virus that causes COVID-19. This means that a COVID -19 vaccine cannot make you sick with COVID-19.

There are several different types of vaccines in development. All of them teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19.

#### 2. After getting a COVID-19 vaccine, will I test positive for COVID-19 on a viral test?

No. Neither the recently authorized and recommended vaccines nor the other COVID-19 vaccines currently in clinical trials in the United States can cause you to test positive on viral tests, which are used to see if you have a current infection.

If your body develops an immune response - the goal of vaccination - there is a possibility you may test positive on some antibody tests. Antibody tests indicate you had a previous infection and that you may have some level of protection against the virus. Experts are currently looking at how COVID-19 vaccination may affect antibody testing results.

# *3. If I have already had COVID-19 and recovered, do I still need to get vaccinated with a COVID-19 vaccine?*

Yes. Due to the severe health risks associated with COVID-19 and the fact that re-infection with COVID-19 is possible, vaccine should be offered to you regardless of whether you already had COVID-19 infection. CDC is providing recommendations to federal, state, and local governments about who should be vaccinated first.


#### 4. Will a COVID-19 vaccination protect me from getting sick with COVID-19?

Yes. COVID-19 vaccination works by teaching your immune system how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19, and this protects you from getting sick with COVID-19.

Being protected from getting sick is important because even though many people with COVID-19 have only a mild illness, others may get a severe illness, have long-term health effects, or even die.

#### 5. Will a COVID-19 vaccine alter my DNA?

No. COVID-19 mRNA vaccines do not change or interact with your DNA in any way.

# **"COVID-19" - A DISASTER OR NOT?**

A disaster can be defined as a serious disruption of the functioning of a community, society or country causing widespread human, material, economic and/or environmental losses which exceed the ability of the affected entity to cope using its own resources. Disasters can be classified as either natural or man-made or a combination of both.

#### Does the Covid-19 pandemic qualify as a disaster?

A disaster may result in health impacts such as diseases and deaths, social and economic losses. The COVID-19 pandemic combines these characteristics and can be treated as a global disaster.

### Is the Covid-19 pandemic a naturally-induced or man-made disaster?

Natural hazards are *extreme events* that occur naturally and cause harm to people and resources. They can be **biological** such as disease epidemics/pandemics. A pandemic is classified as a natural hazard. The widespread impact of COVID-19 illustrates the systemic nature of risk in several areas. The social, political, and financial consequences can persist for years. The pandemic has exposed deep-rooted vulnerabilities in public health infrastructure, supply chains and disaster management mechanisms. There has been a dramatic loss of human life, challenges to public health, food systems and the world of work. There is also significant psychological and social effects on the population such as post-traumatic stress disorder, anxiety, depression and other symptoms of distress.

#### Some ways of coping are:

- Taking care of your emotional health use support services; counseling or therapy.\*
- **Taking care of your body** deep breaths, stretches, meditation, eating nutritious meals, exercising regularly and getting enough rest.
- **Taking breaks** from watching, reading, or listening to news stories, including those on social media.
- Making time to unwind doing some activities you enjoy or try to explore new hobbies
- **Connecting with others**\* communicating with trusted persons about your feelings and concerns.
- Connecting with your community participating in extra-curricular clubs, community/faith-based organizations
- Contacting a health professional or facility if you are sick and concerned about COVID-19
