The Specialist Medical Office (Infectious Diseases) will report to the Medical Director or any other duauthorized officers.	The Specialist Medical Officer is responsible for administering emergency medical treatment to patients at the hospital. Work involves serving as consultant to more junior Medical Officers and is performed independently and subject to administrative review by a professional superior through conferences and analysis of reports and observations.	

#### 6. SPECIFIC ACCOUNTABILITIES

The Specialist Medical Officer (Infectious Diseases):

- Organizes, plans and directs all activities and performs specialist medical work in the area of Infectious Diseases throughout the Authority.
- Oversees the management of patients inclusive of reviewing medical records, conducting physical examinations, ordering appropriate tests, and developing a treatment plan.
- Establishes work schedules, ensures the efficient and adequate medical coverage and participates in training programmes.
- Initiates and directs staff conferences to discuss medical problems for infectious control purposes.
- Performs emergency medical interventions and procedures within the scope of practice of Infectious Disease.
- Administers emergency medical treatment to patients and serve as a consultant to junior doctors.
- Oversees and manages the HIV and Aids Coordinating Unit at the Authority inclusive of Secondary and Primary Care.
- Conducts training programmes with clinical, nursing and other employees, in the appropriate practices and policies of infection diseases.
- Collaborates with HIV/AIDS Coordinating Unit (HACU) in the development and roll out of national initiatives and objectives.
- Participates in infectious diseases Committees and infection prevention related duties as requested.
- Performs any other related work as may be required by the appropriate Authority

# 7. KEY KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

- □ Extensive knowledge of the principles, practices, techniques and modern developments in a particular field of specialization.
- □ Knowledge of the administrative practices and procedures, rules, policies and standards
- Ability to examine patients, diagnose, prescribe and administer necessary treatment in the specialty of Infectious Diseases.
- Ability to organize and supervise the work of junior medical officers, and to guide and advise them on medical matters.
- Ability to gain the confidence and co-operation of patients and to establish and maintain effective working relationships with other employees and the public.

- Possession of a specialist medical degree in Infectious Diseases or equivalent specialist degree as recognized by the Medical Board of Trinidad and Tobago
- A minimum of seven (7) years' working experience in the field of Infectious Diseases.
- Registered with the Medical Board of Trinidad and Tobago as a Medical Practitioner and Specialist Registration Infectious Diseases.
