This year, the ERHA has reintroduced Community Consultations allowing members of the community to share concerns and suggestions for improvement in the health services offered.


Ten (10) sessions have been conducted thus far throughout the months of January - March at various health facilities and issues raised at these forums are currently being addressed at Management Team meetings.

PRE-CARNIVAL SCHOOL PROGRAMME

In February 2018, the ERHA's Health Education Departments in collaboration with the Medical Social Work Department, School Health Unit, Ministry of Health and the Community Police, conducted a Pre-Carnival Programme at various secondary schools and institutions within the Eastern Region.

Over fifteen hundred (1,500) students were sensitized on topics such as, Music and Behaviour, Age Appropriate Behaviour, Effects of Alcohol and Drugs, Sexual Transmitted Infections, Food Safety and Personal Safety.

County Nariva/Mayaro's sessions were titled, "Song Talk" where emphasis was placed on the influence of music on behaviour during the Carnival Season.

County St. Andrew/St. David's programmes also focused on music and behaviour; playing popular Soca songs and analysing the lyrics to identify its messages.

Additionally, as part of the *Food Safety* segment conducted at County St. Andrew/St. David's sessions, students were dressed in complete and incomplete food handlers gear (gloves, apron, hair net and food badge) to discuss safety tips for buying street food at Carnival events.

ERHA ATTENDS THE 33RD CARIBBEAN EPI MANAGERS' MEETING

The Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) and the World Health Organization (WHO) in collaboration with the Ministry of health, hosted its 33rd Caribbean EPI Managers' Meeting on February 23, 2018 at the Hilton Trinidad & Conference Centre.

Healthcare professionals throughout the Caribbean attended, including ERHA's Indardaye Maharaj, Primary Care Nurse Manager and Eleanor Eccles, Senior District Health Visitor, County Nariva/Mayaro.

The overall objective of the EPI Managers' Meeting was to analyse achievements in the past year and to plan activities while sharing experiences on the immunization programme.

The Caribbean EPI Meeting focused on achieving 95% immunization coverage for all children ages 0-5 years with the following vaccines:

- Pentavalent
- Polio
- Yellow Fever
- MMR

Additionally, MMR 2 or 2nd MMR which was previously administered to children at 4 years of age will now be given to children from age 2 in an effort to improve immunization coverage.

The ERHA continues to work with the Ministry of Health in ensuring that vaccines are administered to persons throughout the Region and that the quality of service provided to the population is continuously improving.

QUESTION & ANSWER

Question: Can I change my Nominated Beneficiary on my Pension Plan?

Answer: Yes. You can do this by completing another Nomination of Beneficiary Form and submitting it to the Secretary of the Pension Management Committee. It is important that you keep your nomination up to date as your personal circumstances change. Failure to fill out a Nomination of Beneficiary Form will result in a lump sum benefit due on your death being paid to your legal personal representative(s).

- An operation that places a healthy organ in your body.
- A test that helps measure how well your kidneys are working.
- A disease in which your body cannot make enough insulin or use it well. It is a leading cause of kidney disease.
- Doing enough of this on a regular basis will help keep your heart and kidneys healthy.

DOWN

- This person can help you plan healthy, nutritious meals.
- This process filters waste products and extra fluid from your blood through a machine. It is a common treatment for kidney failure.
- Eating less of this can help control blood pressure and reduce swelling.
- A doctor who specializes in treating people with kidney disease.
- Chemicals produced by different glands and organs, including the kidneys, to trigger certain responses in your body.
- Having small amounts of this in your urine can be a sign of kidney disease.
- This organ helps to keep your body's system in balance. Among other things, it removes waste and extra fluid from your body.
