# Holiday Wellness: Mind, Body & Balance

The holiday season can bring warmth, connection and joy; however, it can also bring challenges such as holiday blues, unhealthy food choices and excessive alcohol consumption. Recognising these challenges, the Health Education Department hosted several health promotion activities throughout the month of December, aimed at encouraging healthy

lifestyle habits during the festive season and beyond.

Staff webinars were conducted to assist employees to identify the signs of holiday depression, low mood and burnout in both themselves and their colleagues on December 3 and 15 2025. The sessions also highlighted the importance of balanced food choices, preventing dehydration and controlling alcohol consumption.

Additionally, the Health Education Department Nariva/Mayaro in collaboration with the Nutrition Department hosted a programme on December 11 2025, at the Guayaguayare Outreach Centre entitled **"Healthier Eating During the Holidays."** The session focused on the importance of reading food labels, facts about fats and sodium, prevention and management of Non-Communicable Diseases during the Christmas season.

## Exercise Lecture and Armchair Aerobics Session

**According to the World Health Organization, insufficient physical activity is one of the leading risk factors for death worldwide and is on the rise.**

Noting this growing concern, the Valencia Wellness Centre in collaboration with the Health Education Department hosted a wellness session to provide more opportunities for individuals particularly older adults to become and remain physically active.

The wellness session was conducted on December 15, 2025 at Valencia Outreach Centre under the theme **"Staying Healthy and Active in Your Twilight."**

Mr. Isaac John, Health Education Aide,

delivered an interactive lecture on the importance of regular exercise. Participants also learned how physical activity helps reduce the risk of developing chronic diseases, supports disease management, prolongs independence and improves quality of life.

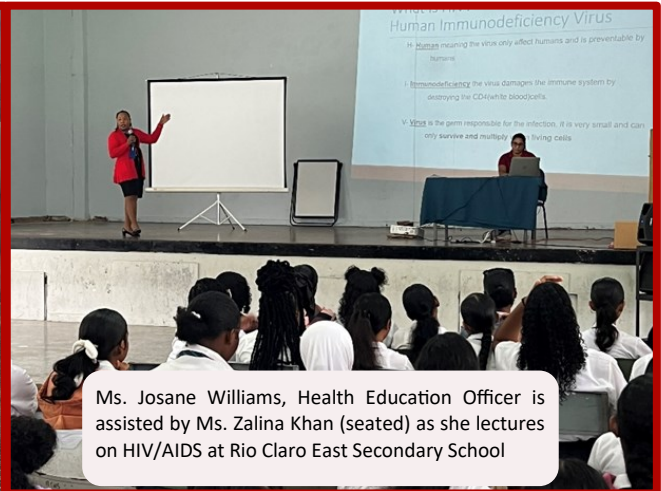
A key highlight of the session was a 20-minute high energy armchair aerobics session. The participants practiced alternative ways to get physically fit and to strengthen specific parts of the body associated with mobility problems.

To further support participants' well-being, grocery vouchers were distributed at the end of the session.

# Promoting HIV Awareness in the Communities

World Aids Day which is observed on December 1, serves as an important reminder that we must remain steadfast in our commitment to prevent new HIV infections and provide essential service to all people living with HIV in our communities.

This year, the ERHA under the theme **"Overcoming disruption, transforming the AIDS response"** used multiple platforms to raise awareness to stakeholders within the communities we serve.

In county St. Andrew/St. David, outreach activities were held by the Coryal and Valencia Outreach Centres on December 9 and 12, 2025 respectively to provide information and to improve access to HIV testing services for members of the community. At the Villa'z Bar Car Park, Valencia Old Road, services such as blood pressure, blood sugar, body mass index and the Influenza vaccine were also available. Staff from the Nutrition and Medical Social Work Departments were also present to provide guidance and support to clients.

In Nariva/Mayaro, the Health Education Department hosted an HIV/AIDS sensitisation

programme at the Rio Claro East Secondary School on December 3, 2025 for students 15 to 19 years of age. The specially designed programme focused on HIV transmission, prevention strategies, treatment options, common myths surrounding HIV/AIDS, HIV statics recorded amongst teenagers and stigma surrounding HIV infections in Trinidad and Tobago. The topics were presented by Ms. Josane Williams, Health Education Officer, Ms. Melissa Wright, District Health Visitor and Mr. Ronaldo Toney, Surveillance Officer of the National HIV/AIDS Coordinating Unit. To reinforce learning, a short game of Pictionary was conducted by Ms. Zalina Khan and Ronald Ram, Health Education Aides, allowing students to test their understanding in a fun and interactive way.

Members of the Chronic Disease Clinic in Rio Claro were also engaged in an HIV sensitisation session at the Health Centre on December 5, 2025. Awareness activities such as these allow persons to understand how HIV is transmitted, how it can be prevented and why early testing is essential in an effort to improve their quality of life.

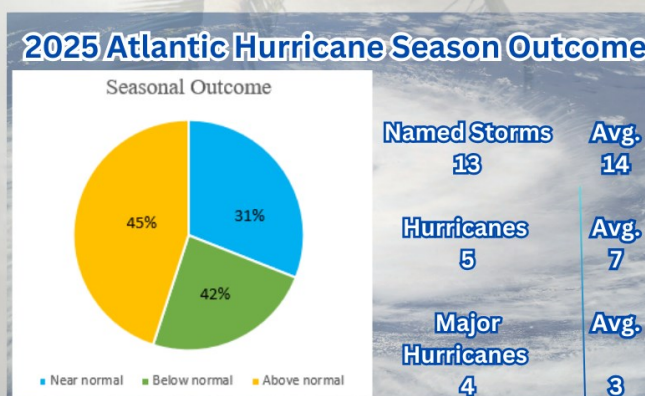
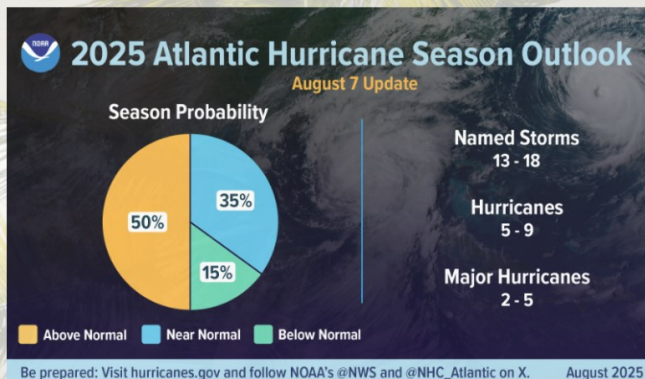


# Atlantic Hurricane Season Recap - 2025

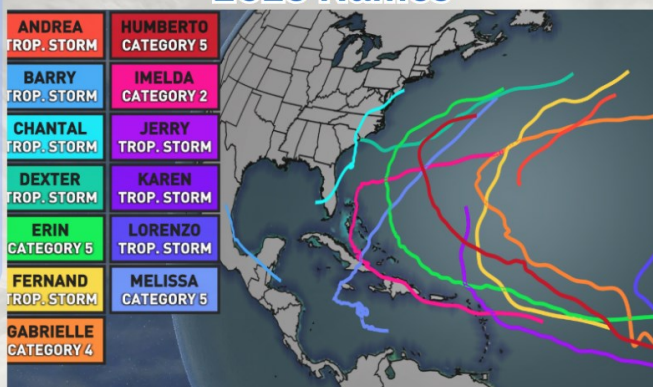
The 2025 hurricane season began June 01 and ended November 30.

Thirteen tropical cyclones were recorded for this year's Atlantic Hurricane Season. Eight tropical storms were noted while an additional five cyclones would have strengthened into hurricanes. The National Hurricane Center stated that four of those hurricanes became major hurricanes, with minimum sustained winds of 179km per hour.

Tropical Storm Andrea was the first cyclone recorded on June 23, 2025. The season was officially ended by the TTMS on December 01, 2025. Hurricane Melissa was the last cyclone of an active and impactful hurricane season characterized by fewer storms overall but a higher rate of intensification.



## 2025 Names





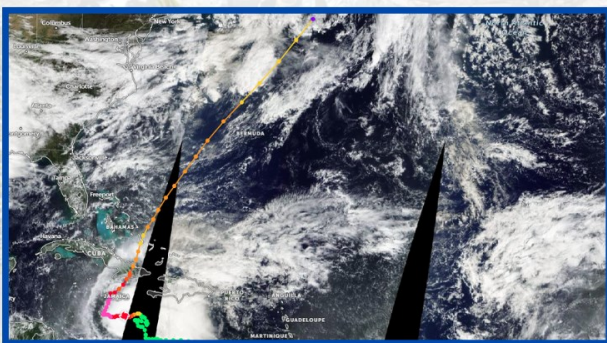
# Atlantic Hurricane Season Recap - 2025

## *Hurricane Melissa Synopsis: The Third Strongest Hurricane Recorded*

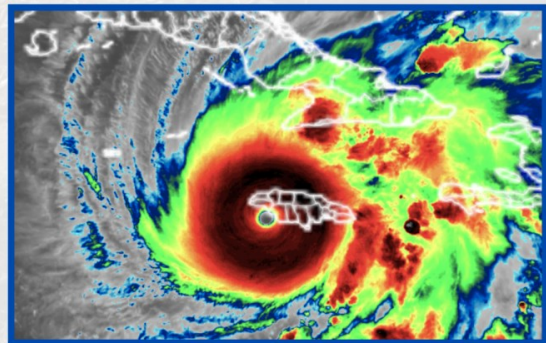
In 2025, Hurricane Melissa was one of the strongest hurricanes formed in the Atlantic basin. It first appeared as a tropical storm on October 21, 2025. On October 25, 2025 this cyclone then intensified into a category-one hurricane, by the following day it strengthened to a category-four and on October 27, 2025 the cyclone reached peak intensity as a major category-five hurricane.

This system made landfall on October 28, 2025 and fully dissipated by November 04, 2025 but not without displacing many Caribbean nationals. According to the National Hurricane Center (2025), Melissa reached maximum sustained winds of approximately 298 km/h, a minimum central pressure of 892 mb, and an accumulated cyclone energy (ACE) of  $34.7 \times 10^4$  kt<sup>2</sup>.

Highlighting the system's organized structure with a well-defined eye and an extremely tight pressure gradient. Notably, Melissa was a slow-moving system, with a forward speed that at times dropped below approximately 10 km/h (about 5 kt). This slow motion prolonged the storm's interaction with warm ocean waters, enabling it to sustain extreme intensity for an extended period. Melissa's exceptional intensity was driven by warm sea surface temperatures, elevated subsurface ocean heat content and favorable atmospheric conditions. These factors, combined with broader climate-related warming of the Atlantic, contributed to Melissa becoming one of the strongest hurricanes observed and a defining benchmark storm for the 2025 season.
